**Detailed Project Report and Environmental Assessment and FONSI for the**  
**Bosque Revitalization @ Route 66 Project, Albuquerque, Bernalillo County, New Mexico**

The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (Corps), Albuquerque District, has released a **Detailed Project Report and Environmental Assessment (DPR/EA) and Finding of No Signification Impact (FONSI) for the Bosque Revitalization @ Route 66 Project, Albuquerque, Bernalillo County, New Mexico** for a proposal to improve the Rio Grande bosque ecosystem function in central Albuquerque. Project components would include removing jetty jacks and non-native vegetation, such as salt cedar (*Tamarix ramosissima*), Russian olive (*Elaeagnus angustifolia*) and Siberian elm (*Ulmus pumila*); enhancing existing high-flow channels, outfall wetlands and other alterations for improving floodplain function of the bosque between Interstate 40 and Bridge Blvd. Improvements of existing facilities for educational, interpretive and low-impact recreational uses are also proposed in the Route 66 Project. Project construction is proposed to begin in October 2008 and continue through April 2010, though no work would occur between May 1 and August 30.
