



ANDRE P. BALYOZ

DEPUTY DISTRICT ENGINEER, ALBUQUERQUE DISTRICT

Major Andre Balyoz was commissioned through the Army ROTC program at Wake Forest University on 17 May 1993. He most recently served as the Battalion Executive Officer for the 4th Engineer Battalion at Fort Carson, Colorado.

After attending the Engineer Officer Basic Course in 1993, he was assigned to the 40th Engineer Battalion in Baumholder, Germany where he served as an engineer line platoon leader, the Battalion S2, and an assault and obstacle platoon leader. This included 12 months serving in Bosnia both as the Battalion S2 and as an Assault and Obstacle platoon leader.

After attending the Engineer Officer Advanced Course in 1997 and graduating with a Masters of Science Degree from the University of Missouri – Rolla in Engineering Management, he was again assigned to a unit in Germany, this time the 60th Topographic Detachment in Heidelberg where he served as the Detachment Commander. After 18 months in that position he returned to the 40th Engineer Battalion where he served as the Assistant Battalion Operations Officer and then the Commander of Bravo Company. While commanding B Company, he deployed with the company to Kosovo for six months. Following command he was reassigned to Fort Carson, Colorado where he served as the Battalion S3 for the 1-361st Engineer Battalion (AC/RC).

Major Balyoz attended Command and General Staff College at Fort Leavenworth, Kansas in 2005 after which he returned to Fort Carson to serve with 10th Special Forces Group as the Group Engineer. While in this position he deployed to Iraq to serve as the Engineer for the Combined Joint Special Operations Task Force – Arabian Peninsula. He was assigned to the 4th Engineer Battalion after returning from

Iraq in September 2006 where he served as the Battalion S3 for eleven months and the Battalion Executive Officer for twelve months. In July 2008 he moved to Albuquerque where he is currently assigned as the Deputy District Engineer for the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers Albuquerque District.

Major Balyoz's civilian education includes a Bachelors of Science in Mathematics from Wake Forest University and a Masters of Science in Engineering Management from the University of Missouri – Rolla.

Major Balyoz's awards include the Meritorious Service Medal (with two Oak Leaf Clusters), the Joint Commendation Medal, the Iraq Campaign Medal, the Kosovo Campaign Medal, the Southwest Asia Service Ribbon, the Corps of Engineers Bronze de Fleury Medal, the Airborne badge, and the Air Assault badge.
