

Lieutenant Colonel Kimberly M. Colloton assumed command of the Albuquerque District on July 10, 2008, having recently completed a fellowship with the RAND Arroyo Center, the Army's federally funded research development center (FFRDC).

In 1992 Lieutenant Colonel Colloton was commissioned a Distinguished Military Graduate in the United States Army Corps of Engineers through ROTC.
