Continuing Authorities Program (CAP) provides USACE with the authority to solve water-resource, flood-risk mitigation, and environmental restoration problems in partnership with local sponsors without the need to obtain specific Congressional authorization. CAP projects have two phases, a feasibility phase followed by a design and implementation phase.
