

Bureau of Indian Affairs Office of Facilities Management and Construction

The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers Albuquerque District has Interagency Agreements with the Bureau of Indian Affairs Office of Facilities Management and Construction in Albuquerque, New Mexico. OFMC provides infrastructure support to BIA schools in 26 states. Services provided by Albuquerque District under this agreement include design, construction and construction management.

The initial agreement was signed in June 1999, and included full design and construction responsibility for 2 schools and 2 dormitories at different locations in New Mexico. The first school completed, Dlo'Ay Azhi Community School in Prewitt, New Mexico was dedicated in August, 2003 and was the first Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design (LEED) Certified facility in New Mexico.

Subsequent agreements have been for new schools and dormitories in New Mexico and Arizona. To date, the District has completed new school/dormitory projects in Prewitt, Ft. Wingate, San Felipe, Ojo Encino and Crownpoint in New Mexico, and in Winslow, Leupp and Kayenta, Arizona.

In addition to the major construction projects identified above, the Albuquerque District has completed a number of other support projects, including fire protection, structural analysis, water system upgrade, roads and miscellaneous design and construction. Representative photographs:
