


# PRE-CONSTRUCTION NOTIFICATION (PCN)



What is a PCN?

- Required for certain NWP (and certain activities, thresholds, and/or other considerations)

Consultations can trigger a PCN

- Endangered Species Act Section 7
- National Historic Preservation Act Section 106

Coordination can trigger a PCN

- Wild and Scenic Rivers Act
- Waivers to limits requested

*Provides the opportunity for the District to review a proposed NWP activity to determine if eligible for authorization*



# NATIONWIDE PERMIT PROGRAM



Intent is to streamline the review of similar activities with *no more than minimal adverse environmental effects*

- Reissued every 5 years (typically)
- Rulemaking activity, with interagency review under Executive Order (EO) 12866

Decision documentation completed upfront

- NEPA, Public Interest Review, 404(b)(1) Guidelines
- Establish additional review process (ESA, Historic, etc.)

NWPs authorize:

- Discharges of dredged or fill material into WOUS (**Section 404** CWA)
- Structures or work in navigable waters (**Section 10** RHA of 1899)





# NATIONWIDE PERMIT PROGRAM EFFECTIVE DATES



## 2017 NWP's issued on December 21, 2016

- 52 NWP's were scheduled to expire on March 18, 2022 (12 were changed with the January 2021 final rule and the remaining 40 reissued in the December 2021 final rule had their expiration changed to February 24, 2022)

## January 2021 NWP's issued on January 13, 2021

- 16 NWP's (12 re-issued/modified and four new)
- 32 general conditions and associated definitions
- In effect March 15, 2021, and expires March 14, 2026

## May 20, 2021, Correction to the January 2021 Final Rule

- Language revision NWP 52

## December 2021 NWP's issued on December 27, 2021

- Re-issued 40 NWP's and issued one new NWP
- General conditions & definitions from January 2021 apply here
- In effect February 25, 2022, and expires March 14, 2026

Reissuance and Modification of Nationwide Permits

AGENCY: Army Corps of Engineers, DoD. ACTION: Final rule.

SUMMARY: Nationwide Permits (NWP) authorize certain activities under Section 404 of the Clean Water Act and Section 10 of the Rivers and Harbors Act of 1899 that have no more than minimal individual and cumulative adverse environmental effects. In a proposed rule published in the September 15, 2020, issue of the Federal Register, the Corps proposed to reissue 52 existing NWP and issue five new NWP, plus the NWP general conditions and definitions. In a final rule published in the January 13, 2021, issue of the Federal Register, the Corps reissued 12 of the 52 existing NWP and four of the five new NWP, as well as the NWP general conditions and definitions. In this final rule, the Corps is reissuing the remaining 40 existing NWP and issuing the remaining one new NWP. The NWP general conditions and definitions published in the January 13, 2021, issue of the Federal Register apply to the 41 NWP reissued or issued in this final rule.

DATES: The 41 NWP in this final rule go into effect on February 25, 2022. The 41 NWP in this final rule expire on March 14, 2026.

I. Background

A. General

The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (Corps) issues nationwide permits (NWP) to authorize activities under Section 404 of the Clean Water Act (33 U.S.C. 1344) and Section 10 of the Rivers and Harbors Act of 1899 (33 U.S.C. 403), where those activities will result in no more than minimal individual and cumulative adverse environmental effects. NWP were first issued by the Corps in 1977 (42 FR 37122) to authorize categories of activities that have minimal adverse effects on the aquatic environment with conditions to minimize those adverse effects, without requiring individual permits for those activities. After 1977, NWP have been issued or reissued in 1982 (47 FR 31794), 1984 (49 FR 39478), 1986 (51 FR 41206), 1991 (56 FR 59110), 1995 (60 FR 38650), 1996 (61 FR 65874), 2000 (65 FR 12818), 2002 (67 FR 2020), 2007 (72 FR 11092), 2012 (77 FR 10184), 2017 (82 FR 18660), and 2021 (86 FR 2744).

Section 404(e) of the Clean Water Act provides the statutory authority for the Secretary of the Army, after notice and opportunity for public hearing, to issue general permits on a nationwide basis for any category of activities involving discharges of dredged or fill material into waters of the United States that will cause only minimal individual and cumulative adverse environmental effects for a period of no more than five years after the date of issuance (33 U.S.C. 1344(e)). The Secretary's authority to issue permits has been

# NATIONWIDE PERMIT PROGRAM CHANGES



## Five new NWP

- NWP 55 & NWP 56 – Not applicable in Colorado
- NWP 57 Electric utility line and telecommunications activities
- NWP 58 Utility line activities for water and other substances
- NWP 59 Water reclamation and reuse facilities

**23 NWPs had changes from 2017**





# NEW NATIONWIDE PERMITS FOR 2021 (APPLICABLE IN COLORADO)



Former 2017 NWP 12 (Utility Lines)  
Split into three NWPs (12, 57, and 58)

- New NWP 57 – Electric utility line and telecommunications activities
- New NWP 58 – Utility line activities for water and other substances
- Require temporary fills to be removed in entirety and restored to preconstruction elevation
- 1/2 acre threshold limit for each single and complete project
- NWP 57 and NWP 58 require a PCN (1) if a Section 10 permit is required or (2) if the discharge will result in the loss of greater than 1/10-acre of waters of the United States





# NEW NATIONWIDE PERMITS FOR 2021 (APPLICABLE IN COLORADO)



## New NWP 59– Water Reclamation and Reuse Facilities



- 1/2 acre threshold limit
- Requires a PCN for all activities
- District engineers will evaluate proposed losses of stream bed to determine whether those losses, plus any other losses of waters of the United States caused by discharges of dredged or fill material, will result in no more than minimal individual and cumulative adverse environmental effects, and thus eligible for authorization under this NWP
- In geographic areas where there are regional concerns about cumulative losses of stream bed, division engineers can add regional conditions to this NWP to impose smaller acreage limits on losses of stream bed



# NWP CHANGES (APPLICABLE IN COLORADO)



**NWP 12 Oil or natural gas pipeline activities:** Limit to oil or natural gas pipeline activities. Remove PCN requirements for a list of activities. Added a PCN requirement for new oil or natural gas pipelines more than 250 miles in length

**NWP 14 Linear Transportation Projects:** Driveways were added to the list of examples of authorized activities. “Driveways” was defined to apply broadly to include features that are used by vehicles to move to and from buildings, and other facilities, and noted that the term is not limited to those associated with a single unit or multiple unit residences

**NWP 17 Hydropower Projects:** Modified to increase total generating capacity from 5,000 kW to 10,000 kW

**NWP 21 Surface coal mining activities:** Removed the 300 linear foot limit for losses of stream bed. Removed waiver provision. Removed reference to integrated permit processing procedures. Removed requirement for written verification



# NWP CHANGES (APPLICABLE IN COLORADO)



**NWP 27 Aquatic Habitat Rest. (et al) Activities:** Modified to add releases of sediment from reservoirs to restore or sustain downstream habitat to the list of examples of activities authorized by this NWP

**NWP 36 Boat ramps:** Added “repair” and “replacement” of boat ramps.

**NWP 41 Reshaping Existing Drainage and Irrigation Ditches:** Modified to include irrigation ditches

**NWP 44 Mining Activities:** Removed the 300 linear foot limit for losses of stream bed. Removed waiver provision. Limit mining in non-tidal navigable waters of the United States (i.e., S. 10 waters) to 1/2-acre

**NWP 49 Coal Remining Activities:** Removed text reference (integrated permit processing procedures)

**NWP 50 Underground Coal Mining Activities:** Removed the 300 linear foot limit for losses of stream bed. Removed waiver provision. Removed requirement for written verification. Removed reference to integrated permit processing procedures. Removed note stating that coal preparation and processing outside the mine site may be authorized by NWP 21

**NWP 53 Removal of Low-Head Dams:** Modified definition of “low-head dam”

**REMOVAL OF 300 LINEAR FOOT LIMIT FOR LOSSES OF STREAMBED FOR THOSE LISTED ABOVE**



# WHY REMOVE THE 300 LINEAR FOOT LIMIT FOR LOSSES OF STREAM BED?



More accurate quantification of losses of stream bed

- Streams within watersheds vary substantially in size
- More defensible determinations of “no more than minimal impacts”

Consistent limits for all categories of non-tidal waters

Consistency with 404(b)(1) Guidelines, which provide greater protection for special aquatic sites (e.g., wetlands)

Establish compensatory mitigation requirement for losses of greater than 3/100-acre of stream bed





# CHANGES TO GENERAL CONDITIONS (APPLICABLE TO COLORADO)



GC 13, Removal of temporary fills - added “structures” to require removal of temporary structures

GC 17, Tribal rights - Restored text of general condition that was in 2012 and prior NWP's

GC 18, Endangered species - Removed definitions of “direct effects” and “indirect effects”. Replaced with references to the 2019 FWS and NMFS regulations defining:

- “effects of the action” [50 CFR 402.02]
- “activities that are reasonably certain to occur” [50 CFR 402.17(a)]
- “consequences caused by the proposed action” [50 CFR 402.17(b)]

GC 25, Water quality - If project proponent cannot comply with all conditions for the WQC issued by certifying authority for issuance of the NWP, then he or she must obtain an individual WQC or waiver for the proposed discharge

GC 28, use of multiple NWP's - Clarified use of NWP's with different numeric limits, with examples



# CHANGES TO GENERAL CONDITIONS (APPLICABLE TO COLORADO)



## GC 23, Mitigation

- Compensatory mitigation at a minimum one-for-one ratio will be required for all losses of stream bed that exceed 3/100-acre and require pre-construction notification, *unless the district engineer provides an activity-specific waiver of this requirement*
  - District engineer may require other forms of mitigation
  - Mitigation requirement may be satisfied through restoration or enhancement of riparian areas next to streams
- Acre-based mitigation requirements will be consistent with wetland mitigation requirement for NWPs



# CHANGES TO GENERAL CONDITIONS AND PCN REQUIREMENTS



## GC 32, Pre-construction notification:

- Clarification added for linear projects where one or more single and complete crossings require PCN, the quantity of anticipated losses of wetlands and waters included in the PCN will be used by the district engineer to evaluate the cumulative adverse environmental effects of the proposed linear project and does not change those non-PCN NWP activities into NWP PCNs

The NWP PCN form (Form ENG 6082) or a letter should be used for NWP PCNs

Remove the agency coordination provision for PCNs requesting waivers of the 300 linear foot limit for losses of stream bed

20 NWPs –no PCN required  
14 NWPs – some activities require a PCN  
23 NWPs- all activities require a PCN

*Where no PCN is required- applicant is still responsible for ensuring that the project qualifies for that applicable NWP and that all terms and conditions are met*



# CHANGES TO NWP DEFINITIONS



Removed definitions of:

- Ephemeral stream
- Intermittent stream
- Protected tribal resources

Modified definition of:

- Modified definitions of “ordinary high-water mark” and “perennial stream”
- Modified definition of “loss of waters of the United States” to remove references to quantifying stream bed losses in linear feet





# ROAD AHEAD AND...



## 2017 NWP's that hadn't already changed with the January 2021 Final Rule expired **February 24, 2022**

effects. The NWP's authorize a variety of activities, such as aids to navigation, utility line crossings, erosion control activities, road crossings, stream and wetland restoration activities, residential developments, mining activities, commercial shellfish aquaculture activities, and agricultural activities. The two new NWP's authorize the removal of low-head dams and the construction and maintenance of living shorelines. Some NWP activities may proceed without notifying the Corps, as long as those activities comply with all applicable terms and conditions of the 330.1(b)). Activities authorized by NWP's and other general permits must be similar in nature, cause only minimal adverse environmental effects when performed separately, and will have only minimal cumulative adverse effect on the environment (see 33 U.S.C. 1344(e)(1)). Nationwide permits can also be issued to authorize activities pursuant to Section 10 of the Rivers and Harbors Act of 1899 (see 33 CFR 322.2(f)). The NWP program is designed to provide timely authorizations for the regulated public while protecting the Nation's aquatic resources.



# ...THE GRANDFATHERING PROVISION



# GRANDFATHERING PROVISION 33 CFR 330.6(B)



12 NWP's that were re-issued March 2021 are grandfathered UNTIL March 18, 2022

40 NWP's that were re-issued from the December 27, 2021, Final Rule, are grandfathered for 12 months after expiration of the 2017 applicable NWP

- For the 40 NWP's previously authorized under the 2017 NWP's with original expiration of March 18, 2022, are grandfathered provided
  - Construction for the authorized impacts has started or is under contract to start by the NWP expiration
  - Work in authorized impacts to WOUS must be completed within the 12 month period

*Under 33 CFR 330.6(b), Corps Headquarters may modify, reissue, suspend, or revoke the NWP's at any time.*

Activity must be completed within 12 months of the date of an NWP's expiration, modification, or revocation, unless discretionary authority has been exercised by a division/district engineer on a case-by-case basis to modify, suspend, or revoke the authorization in accordance with 33 CFR 330.4(e) and 33 CFR 330.5(c) or (d)

*Twelve-month period is known as the grandfathering period*



## RECAP



- All 2021 NWP's are now in effect and will expire March 14, 2026
- 2017 NWP's have expired but with the grandfathering clause if you have started construction and/or are under contract the clause may apply to you (refer to previous slide and your specific permit conditions)


